

The CARES Act repeals the ACA's Medicine Cabinet Tax, allowing individuals to use their medical spending account to purchase over-the-counter products and medications.

## OVER-THE-COUNTER DRUGS AND MEDICINES UPDATE

If you have a Health FSA, HSA, or certain type of HRA plan that includes all IRS-allowed out-of-pocket medical/dental/vision expenses, we are excited to let you know that the CARES Act, passed by Congress last Friday afternoon, contains a provision allowing reimbursement of over-the-counter (OTC) drugs and medicines without a prescription for these plans.

## CARES ACT AND QUALIFYING MEDICAL EXPENSES

This is retroactive to the beginning of the year, so any over-the-counter drugs and medicines (such as pain relievers, cold and allergy medicines, acne treatments, and many others) purchased since 1/1/2020 and within your current plan year are now reimbursable without a prescription. Also, the CARES Act added menstrual care items to the eligible items list.

You should follow the protocol for submitting a claim for reimbursement or use of your medical spending account as set forth by your plan's guidelines. For more information on your medical spending account, please contact your plan administrator.
